# DPS response squashes worms, viruses

While other governmental agencies and companies across the U.S. have been hit hard by worms and viruses, DPS has managed to escape much of the carnage.

In August, the NACHI worm struck DPS and thousands of businesses and home computers worldwide. DPS technical support employees worked countless hours to keep the agency's computers running with minimal disruption to users.

Unlike governmental agencies in other states, DPS computers remained up throughout the crisis.

"The hard work by the Information Management Service helped save DPS money and time--and helped the agency continue to serve the people of Texas in a timely manner," said Col. Tommy Davis. "We appreciate what they did and continue to do."

DPS employees have helped the agency survive these attacks because they have been quick to respond to Department-wide e-mails with instructions on how to contain the viruses, said **George Frimpter**, Data Security Officer, and **Sherry Koenning-Cook**, manager of Systems Technology Services.

"One of our biggest strengths is that we have a number of ways to quickly communicate with our users," Koenning-Cook said. "And with vicontinued on page 4

## **Customer Service Bureau has the answer**

If you think your phone rings off the hook, you should go visit the DL Division's Customer Service Bureau: 41 employees handle approximately 75,000 telephone calls each month!

Customer Service staffs the agency's switchboard (512-424-2000), sending calls from all over the world to the appropriate office within DPS. It's possible that without Customer Service, the entire agency would grind to a halt.

Mondays are the heaviest call day during the week, with approximately 20,000 calls jamming the lines. Tak-

ing more than 100 calls each, customer service representatives are able to handle only 4,000 of those calls.

If you ever direct a member of the public to the Customer Service line (512-424-2600), be sure to advise them to call early in the morning, or on Thursdays or Fridays, when the agency receives fewer phone calls.

Customer Service representatives receive a variety of calls from the public, including urgent situation calls. Customer Service representative **Mariana Rivas** recently handled continued on page 4

Dear Fellow Employee:

On October 13, we welcomed yet another recruit class to the Academy. The 141 trooper-trainees who started the academy have several months of hard work ahead of them before they graduate on April 23, 2004.

During their 27-week school, these trooper-trainees will experience many changes, just as the rest of DPS is experiencing. Hundreds of our fellow employees have retired over the past two years, and many of you have promoted or taken on new responsibilities.

Here's something to put it into perspective: In the past two years, 652 new troopers have graduated from the DPS Academy. That's roughly *one-quarter* of the Texas Highway Patrol, and one-fifth of the total number of commissioned officers here at DPS.

Even with these new recruits, we still have work to do. We've tentatively scheduled a new recruit class to begin February 2, 2004. The application deadline is soon. If you know someone who is interested in joining DPS, I urge you to have them contact Recruiting ASAP.

### Awards

Sergeants Keith Kucifer and Frank Cantu, MVT Houston, received Director's Citations for their outstanding investigative performance concerning a professional vehicle theft ring. Throughout their yearlong investigation, Sergeants Kucifer and Cantu conducted more than 150 interviews and attained nearly as many sworn statements from those involved. Because most of the victims were Hispanic, Cantu had to translate the majority of these interviews and statements. Their hard work and persistence resulted in the recovery of 110 stolen vehicles, valued at more than \$1 million, as well as several arrests. Additional recoveries and arrests are anticipated.

Tr. Tywan Shelton, HP Cedar Hill, received a Director's Citation and Dallas Police Dept. Detective Chris Daniels received a Director's Award for their quick response and action that saved the life of a 67-yearold female who fainted at church during Thanksgiving. Det. Daniels was working off-duty at the Dallas church when he was notified that Irma Wheeler had fainted. Tr. Shelton also responded and the two officers, once establishing that Wheeler was not breathing, began CPR for 15 minutes before paramedics arrived. When the woman reached the hospital, she regained consciousness. Firefighter paramedic Darrell Maxwell stated that "if it were not for the life saving skills performed by Trooper Shelton and Corporal Daniels, Ms. Wheeler may not have experienced a very tearful and happy reunion with her daughter in the hospital room." Sgt. Raymond Williams, DL Cedar Hill, nominated Daniels.

•Be suspicious of unsolicited emails, especially those from people you don't know and those with attachments but no explanation of what the attachment is. Delete them!

- •If you're not sure whether something is a virus, ask Data Security. You can reach Data Security by e-mail at data\_security@txdps.state.tx.us.
- •Most important: DO NOT use the preview option in Outlook! It can automatically launch a virus or worm.

# TRIP targets stolen heavy equipment

In an effort to stop the rapid rise in farm and construction equipment theft, the DPS Motor Vehicle Theft Service has implemented the Texas Recovery and Identification Program (TRIP).

The statewide database is available to law enforcement officials throughout the state to assist in identifying stolen equipment and returning it to the rightful owner.

Since equipment ownership is so difficult to track in these cases, less

than 20 percent of the stolen farm and commercial grade equipment is ever recovered. DPS MVT investigators hope TRIP will help.

Farm and commercial equipment owners participate by entering their equipment information into the password-protected database accessible through the DPS Web site.

More than 100 pieces of construction and farm equipment are stolen every month in Texas.
